TITANIC SINKING; NO LIVES LOST

NEW YORK, April 15.—The White Star liner Titanic is sinking according to latest reports.

PASSENGERS TRANSFERRED TO CUNARD LINER CARPATHIA—ALL ARE NOW SAFE

Wireless Dispatches Show That 1 Mammoth Liner After Striking Iceberg Sunk Under 1000 Feet. But Water-Tight Compartments Kept Her From Foundering.

TITANIC IS NOW ON HER WAY TO HALIFAX

MONTREAL, dispatches up to now today showed that the passengers of the White Star liner Titanic, which struck an iceberg off Newfoundland coast last night, were being transferred aboard the steamer Carpathia, a Cunarder.

Already twenty boats had been transferred, and allowing forty to sixty more, at the capacity of each lifeboat, some 800 or 1,200 persons have been transferred.

Latest reports indicate that the transference is being carried on safely.

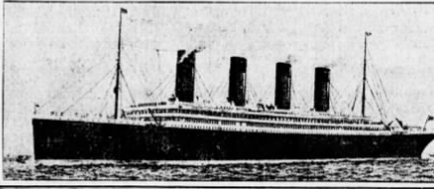

HALIFAX, April 15.—The Canadian government marine agency here received a wireless message at 1:10 p.m. that the Titanic is sinking.

NOTHING OFFICIAL

NEW YORK, April 15.—Vice-President Franklin of the White Star Line said at 4 o'clock that he had received the wireless message that all passengers had been transferred from the Titanic.

LOCAL MANAGER TITANIC PASSENGER

Halifax, N. S., April 15.—With its 1,200 passengers and crew transferred to another vessel, the White Star liner Titanic, which struck an iceberg off Newfoundland last night, is slowly approaching the port, following a disastrous collision last night with a monster iceberg, about 600 miles east of New York.

The fact that the Titanic is the world's biggest vessel is probably the only thing that prevented great loss of life. It is now believed that any other craft afloat could have withstood the shock.
